A RESOLUTION TO SET DATE AND TIME FOR PUBLIC HEARING TO VACATE OR ABANDON A PUBLIC ROAD

WHEREAS, Sec. 39-1722 Nebr. R.R.S., 1943, makes provisions for a county Board of Commissioners as to the vacation or abandonment of public roads in its county; and

WHEREAS, a clear and unambiguous description of the roads to be relocated, vacated or abandoned, is as follows, to-wit:

At intersection F Avenue and Blyburg Road – starting 600 feet North of the intersection of F Avenue and Blyburg – continue North approximately 5170 feet to the creek for road closure. Section 12 & 13, Township 27N, Range 8E and Section 7 & 8, Township 27N, Range 8E, Dakota County, Nebraska

WHEREAS, by action of the Dakota County Board of Commissioners on April 29, 2024, Dakota County Highway Superintendent Jolene Gubbels was directed to perform a study and report to the Board as provided by the laws of the State of Nebraska; and,

WHEREAS on May 28, 2024, Ms. Gubbels submitted a written report to the Board with the following findings
and recommends to vacate the described road and relinquish the right-of-way back to the adjacent landowners.

- 1. The portion of road that the County desires to vacate is a minimum maintenance road that passes through farm fields.

- 3. The County no longer maintains this portion of road.
